



2nd Annual World's Longest Continuous Running Lacrosse Game

The Penn-Air & Hydraulics Foundation in conjunction with the York County Lacrosse Association is pleased to host the 2nd Annual World's Longest Continuous Running Lacrosse Game. This event is being played in memory of Travis Sipe, a young man who passed away in October of 2004 as a result of a tragic car accident that occurred in March of 2001.

Travis, a 16 year old Sophomore at the time and one of the original members of the York Lacrosse Club, had just received his driver's license. The next day, he contributed 5 goals and 1 assist in his first game that spring for Dallastown. On his way home that evening, Travis fell asleep at the wheel. Paramedics rescued him from the single vehicle accident that Saturday evening. Travis spent the next three and a half years fighting for his life while in a coma like state. He passed away on October 24th, 2004.

The York County lacrosse community came by the side of the Sipe family to support Travis through a number of events over the years. The "**Take it to the Goal...#14**" Fundraiser in 2003 raised over \$7,000 which enabled Travis to receive a customized wheel chair and transportation to a number of lacrosse games that spring. The generous donations as well as the caring actions of the York County lacrosse players and parents truly helped to make a difference. In 2005, the 1st Annual Longest Game generated nearly \$1,500 which was donated back to the community to help various civic organizations.

Travis enjoyed teaching children the sport of lacrosse. He had a true desire and passion to help children. This is one of the many reasons why we have chosen to support Make-A-Wish Foundation® with the income generated from this worthwhile event.

The **Guinness Book of World Records** does state that any continuous running game must be played with a roster that limits the total number of players. Although we had hoped to set an official world record with Guinness, our event will qualify as the "unofficial" record so that we can involve hundreds of York County boys in this exciting game. Travis was one of the first players in the York Lacrosse Club which was started in 1996. As a fifth grader, he played on the inaugural High School team with 19 other boys from around the York County area. In the last 10 years since the first York County lacrosse season, the growth of the sport has been tremendous. In 2006, we had nearly 1,400 boys and girls playing in York County. This spring, we estimate over 1,700 playing throughout the County from 2nd grade up through High School. The Sipe family continues to support the growth of the game so we are proud to be able to honor Travis through this event.

So what do I do next if I am interested.....

If you are interested in registering your team, please contact your Club's Board member. We will be accepting registration forms from each of the 50 plus York County boys teams starting January 28th. The time slots are on a first come first serve basis. Team registration will end on February 25th. The final schedule will be published on Sunday, March 11th. Teams will be scheduled to play for the one hour periods based on similar age level. The first game will begin at 7:14 am. We will play 14 minute quarters. At the end of the first game (4 quarters), the next two teams will step onto the field. The game score will continue from where the prior game score concluded. At the end of the event, we anticipate 17 hours of continuous lacrosse where the score might be 347-336. Everyone who plays wins in this event. All paid players receive a food voucher and a gift. All teams must wear their team jerseys and shorts. If a team does not have a goalie available, then a wooden insert will be installed in the goal and the only way to score will be shooting through the four cut-out corners. Your team's participation is greatly appreciated!
