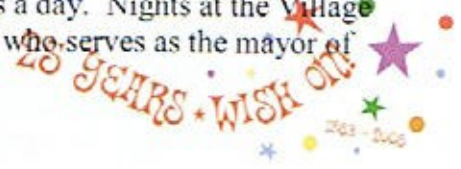
Dear Bob:

Our Wish Granters met with her the week before the Lacrosse event to find out what her wish might be and were happy to find out lots of wonderful things about Cora. As I mentioned in an email to you, Cora is just like any other seven-year-old girl. She loves the color purple, Hanna Montana, ballet and pizza. She asked her Make-A-Wish volunteers if she could visit Disney World for her wish because she excitedly exclaimed that she has never been there before!

It didn't take long for us to plan Cora's wish and she will be visiting sunny Orlando the week of April 27th, 2008. During her week, Cora and her family will stay at the Give Kids the World Village, which is adjacent to the Disney parks. This one-of-a-kind resort was designed especially for wish children, just like Cora's. Each family stays in a condo with a fully-stocked refrigerator, separate TVs for parents and kids, and nearby playgrounds and water parks. The Disney characters join the special guests for breakfast at the Gingerbread House restaurant, and wish kids love the banana split ice cream bar that is open 24 hours a day. Nights at the Village offer fireworks and a cozy tuck-in from Mr. Clayton, a tall bunny who serves as the mayor of Kids Village.
